### The Direct Debit Guarantee

If you request the University of East Anglia to collect a payment, confirmation of the amount and date will be given to you at the time of the request.
- If an error is made in the payment of your Direct Debit, by the University of East Anglia or your bank or building society, you are entitled to a full and immediate refund of the amount paid from your bank or building society – if you receive a refund you are not entitled to, you must pay it back when the University of East Anglia asks you to.
